REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
MINUTES SYNOPSIS
SUNDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2024**

PROCLAMATIONS/SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

Swearing In Ceremony - Fire Department Employee. Mayor Teich presided over a ceremony to swear in the City's newest firefighter: Launa Costello. Launa's shield was pinned by her father, David Costello. Also on hand to witness were her mother Malinda Costello and boyfriend Anthon Harden.

Firemen's Memorial Steering Committee Appreciation. Councilmember Law presented Firemen's Memorial Steering Committee member Travis Schneider, on behalf of the entire Committee, a proclamation of the City of Owosso recognizing the contributions of the members of the Firemen's Memorial Steering Committee for their work in recognizing the County's firefighters that have fallen in the line of duty.

Councilmember Law suggested the Council consider spinning the Steering Committee off so that it no longer operates under the City umbrella. The Council moved to spin off the Firemen's Memorial Steering Committee to stand alone as a 501(c)3.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Proposed Special Assessment District No. 2025-103 - Hazards & Nuisances. Conducted a public hearing to receive citizen comment regarding proposed Special Assessment District No. 2025-103, Hazards & Nuisances, as it relates to unpaid costs incurred in the altering, repairing, tearing down, abating or removing of hazards and nuisances. There were no citizen comments received prior to, or during the hearing. The Council moved to approve the special assessment roll as presented.

Ordinance Amendment – Parks & Recreation Commission Ordinance. Conducted a public hearing to receive citizen comment regarding the proposed amendment to Chapter 2, Administration, Article IV, Boards and Commissions, Division 3, Parks and Recreation Commission, Section 2-242. *Members; appointment, terms, voting, officers*, of the Code of Ordinances. The following person commented in regard to the proposed ordinance amendment: Patrice Martin. The Council moved to approve the ordinance amendment as presented. The ordinance will become effective November 11, 2024.

CITIZEN COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Chrell Hoffman, Aiken Road resident, spoke about the problems she's been experiencing due to the burning of brush at the City's Aiken Road Drop Off Site, including ash covering her home and vehicles, the frequency of the burns, and the smoldering that lingers for a number of days after each fire. She said she has approached several people about the issue, but has yet to find resolution.

Tom Manke thanked Council for spinning off the Firemen's Memorial Steering Committee. He said they are doing a wonderful job, and he was looking forward to the establishment of a worthy memorial.

Patrice Martin spoke about leadership, noting that true leaders serve the people and are not out to burnish their own ego. She celebrated the fact that there are ten candidates running for City Council and encouraged everyone to be open-minded.

Gary Beal said he appreciates each Councilmember and their service to the community. He went on to highlight the service of Mayor Pro-Tem Sue Osika personally thanking her for her dedication to the City and said he has appreciated getting to know the Mayor.

Mayor Teich invited Ms. Hoffman to speak with him about her issue in his office sometime this week, saying he wanted to look into things.
